



1st & 2nd Timothy Paul, the aged and experienced apostle, writes to his young and inexperienced protege, Timothy, who

faces a heavy burden of responsibility as pastor of the church at Ephesus. Paul originally met Timothy during his second missionary journey and shortly afterwards Timothy began working with him. Now the young man must deal with several formidable challenges: He must correct false doctrine, safeguard public worship, and develop mature leadership.

Paul wrote the second letter to Timothy from prison. The letter may be one of the most personal letters we have from the apostle Paul. He knows he faces his final days, yet he finds himself increasingly alone.

Theme: The exhortation of a young pastor by a man seasoned in the faith. Be on the alert for wrong

teachings and cling to the truth.

As you read 1 & 2 Timothy, watch for . . .

.... Fight all your battles on your knees and you win every time. (1 Tim 2:1-4)

.... Anything you hold too tightly you will lose. (1 Tim 6:6-10)

.... The awareness of God's presence energizes us for our work. (2 Tim 2:8-13)

.... God's Word is an immovable anchor in times of storm. (2 Tim 3:16, 17)

Titus, a young pastor, faced the unenviable assignment of setting in order the church at Crete. Paul advised him to appoint elders, men of proven spiritual character, to oversee

the work of the church.

As you read Titus, watch for . . .

Theme: God saves us by His grace to live in a way that honors and pleases Him.

- Brokenness is God's requirement for maximum usefulness. (1:13–16)
- Obey God and leave all the consequences to Him. (2:9, 10)
- Our intimacy with God His highest priority for our lives determines the impact of our lives. (3:4-8)
- No Christian has ever been called to "go it alone" in his or her walk of faith. (3:12-15)

Author: The apostle Paul.

Genuine faith will inevitably produce good deeds. This is the central theme of James' letter, around which he supplies practical advice on living the Christian life. He begins by outlining some general characteristics of the Christian life (1:1-27). Next, he exhorts Christians to act justly in society (2:1-13). He follows this practical advice with a theological discourse on the relationship between faith ad action (2:14-26). In chapter 3, James shows the importance of controlling one's speech. He encourages his readers to turn from evil desires and obey God (4:1-12). Finally, he exhorts his readers to be patient with each other and straightforward in their promises, to pray for each other and to help each other remain faithful to God.

McKinney Community you are invited to come and receive fresh produce provided by the North Texas Food Bank on Saturday, March 25th from 10:30am – 12pm.




